My short answer would be: "We are required to do this."

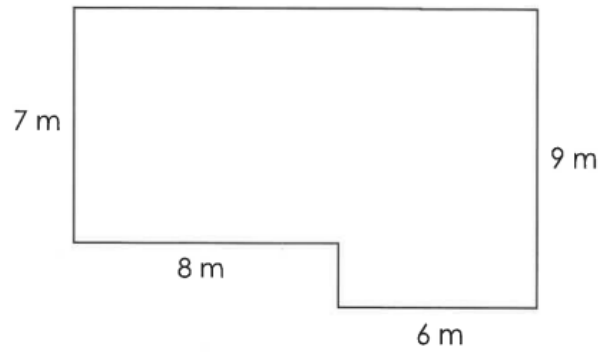
Every year, when State Testing approaches, I share resources with parents so that if they have the desire, they can look further into the topic. Every year, the State releases a certain number of test questions for the public and school districts to see. I have taken a sample of some of these questions to share with you in my update. Please review the items from Grade 3 and Grade 6 on the following pages...

I would emphasize as such:

- 1) These are REAL ACTUAL QUESTIONS that have been used on recent previous Ohio State Tests.
- 2) Notice the higher level of understanding that is required to successfully answer the questions. Sometimes I wonder if the public would imagine a test to be similar to what they may have taken when they were in school. Notice the level of application is well beyond simple arithmetic. Yes, arithmetic is taught and valued and still tested, but many of the questions require a much higher level of processing. Enjoy!!!





## Upcoming May dates and events for ELEMENTARY

Parents, our unique year of school is nearing the end. We want our last couple of weeks to include events that students look forward to. While some things that take place in normal years may not be able to take place, we have plans to engage our students in some fun, end of year activities.

\*Note... Our teachers and our school do not want the upcoming state testing to cause additional anxiety to our children. I understand that for some kids this can happen. Please just encourage your child to do their best. Students are not held to any standard of performance on the test.

3. Thanks to several of our 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade parents for donating snack options for our upper elementary students! We had an upper level teacher organize a snack break for our 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> graders, who end up having a longer afternoon due to an earlier lunch and recess. Students will certainly appreciate and enjoy the snack in the afternoon!

4. Thank you to Mrs. Griffin and Mr. Sorensen for their efforts in planning the 4<sup>th</sup>-6<sup>th</sup> grade Spring Music Concerts. Our students put on great shows, I was very proud of all of our Arlington Students.

5. We are continuing to plan for a Summer School program focused on Reading Intervention. We are planning for this option to be available to current Kinder-4<sup>th</sup> grade students. We are in the planning stages, so to give definite answers is difficult without knowing the actual number of students wanting to attend. We are expecting to meet 3 days per week, for 2-3 hours each day. We are expecting the program to run from mid-June through mid-August. We will ask that any student who enrolls to the summer program plan to commit and attend with consistency. More information will be coming in the next couple of weeks.

In the name of COVID-19, the topic of student growth and student achievement often comes up. Have the disruptions caused a negative impact on student learning and academic development? The common answer would be 'yes'. I believe it is most true to say there certainly has been some level of impact on the students' progress. So my answer also would be 'yes'.

Rather than leave it at that, I have spent some time recently pulling some past data marks in order to present a more objective look at our local performance. Please know, and please understand that I know, this data does not paint the entire picture. I just simply would like to make available for our community and stakeholders a reference to student performance. This can assist you while making conclusions about the COVID-19 impact to our overall Arlington student population. Please see the next pages below if you want to take a closer look at that data. I am still pulling from some other sources, so I may become more informed over the weeks ahead. In the meantime, feel free to give me a call if you have questions.

Also, in response to our performance and COVID-19 impacts on learning, I want our community to know that we are beginning to make plans for a summer program that will be revamped in order to assist more students. We are brainstorming and hoping for a

program that overall will be more extensive than past years. Please know if you are a parent with a student currently in grades Kindergarten through 4th grade, we hope our summer program can include your child if that is the desire.

**#1) We would like to welcome all of the new faces to our building as we have had a large number of students move in over the past 4 weeks, dating back into December. Some students are new families who have moved into the district and a couple are students who have re-enrolled or joined back from virtual and/or homeschooling.**

**#2) The current COVID numbers in the elementary are much lower than we were experiencing before Christmas Break. We are thankful for that, and we are excited for the potential of increasing our time and returning back to a schedule closer to normal.**

Concerning a reduced day schedule, one thing that I recognize, and I want to share coming from a principal and a parent is that I understand and see a need for our children to have time to socialize and engage with appropriate play with peers. I just want to make note of that for what it is worth to you. Remember, our school days this year have not been conducive to allow for much recess play, lunch room dialogue, and normal types of peer interaction. Those of our students who are energized by social settings and of course recess and play time are really missing that experience. Again, we look forward to a time where some of that returns.

**#3) You will notice report cards coming home on Friday, January 22. Hopefully for those of you with a 3rd-6th grade child, you will find no surprises on the report card marks. ProgressBook keeps current grades, so I encourage parents to utilize ProgressBook to keep a pulse on their child's grades and completed assignments. You will notice a blank 1st quarter. The mark for the 2nd quarter will actually count as the mark for the full semester. There could be some confusion/ misinterpretation of how the attendance is showing on the report card. Please rest assured that our official documentation on school records are accurate. If the school has significant attendance concerns for your child, we have already been in contact with you. Teachers are limited with how much they can fill out in the comments section. If you as a parent are seeking MORE feedback, feel free to reach out to the teacher. As I referenced before, report cards are a nice opportunity for student reflection. Sometimes I ask students how they would grade themselves based strictly on the effort put forth. That is a really nice place to start with a kid.**

**#4) Valentine's Day is coming. For the primary students, valentines can be somewhat of a big deal. Please look for further information regarding classroom plans to be coming soon from your child's teacher.**

**#5) Kindergarten Screening will take place on March 17th. Current Kindergarten students will not have school this day. More information regarding screening can be found on the main page of the school website.**

**#6) Make note of our Spirit Week for the week of February 8. See Below.**

**#7) I don't have much to update for Spring State Testing. Testing normally takes place for third through sixth grade students. At this point, public schools have not been notified of any cancellations to testing due to COVID. These decisions are directed from the state and federal government, and at this moment, we are told to prepare as normal. These tests take place in late March through April.**

### **Attendance Model**

Elementary parents may wonder about future school schedules, pertaining to an interest of an increase or decrease in time of the school day schedule. There have been districts in our area who have made adjustments to their student times (i.e. more days, more hours).

AT THIS TIME, the Kindergarten-6th grade students will remain attending 3 hours daily. Our teachers are thankful to have the ability to interact and instruct in person 5 days a week.

In the event that our county would change to a level RED, our district is likely to remain in the current structure of the hybrid schedule. This is a change from our initial plan, where it was established that a RED County level would result in remote learning. Again, these decisions are revisited often, and can change. At this time, we are anticipating remaining in a Hybrid Model and 3 hour school day if our County Status Advances to RED. ### **Enrichment and Gifted Programs**

Mr. Cheney is in collaboration with 4th, 5th, and 6th grade teachers to develop a broader approach to Gifted Intervention and extension to the curriculum. Please understand some of the existing barriers that make this a challenge.

- 1) Students qualify in various areas. (Creative Thinking, Math, Reading, Superior Cognitive, Science)
- 2) Students attend in one of four sections per day. Teacher A in the a.m., Teacher B in the a.m., Teacher A in the p.m., Teacher B in the p.m.
- 3) Students school time is currently reduced to a 3 hour day.
- 4) Students pulled should remain in a group that is reduced in capacity, and restricted to their grade level.
- 5) Please understand, Public School Districts are required to assess and identify gifted area students. Public School Districts are not required to provide formal gifted services. Arlington Elementary does not provide a broad formal service to all gifted students. It is our desire to seek opportunities to extend, nurture and engage the exceptional student population.
